During the first two weeks of school, our students will receive a presentation relating to school policies and expectations as they are given a copy of the *Baltimore County Public Schools Student Handbook*¹. You should review and revise this form to provide the school with updated contact information. The information included in this document will be used to contact parents/guardians during emergency situations and early school closings. Under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, school systems may release directory information on enrolled students. *The Parental Privacy Preference Opt-Out Form, Rule 6202, Form A* is to be used whenever parents/guardians or eligible students do not permit BCPS to share a student's directory information, do not want the student to use telecommunications, and/or do not want the student's intellectual property published/produced/displayed anywhere. Parents may elect to have their children's information removed from this directory by completing this form. Please include the names of all the children you would like removed from the directory. **If you do not want to "Opt-Out" you do not need to return the form.**

The first day of school for students in grades 1-5 will be **Monday, August 28, 2023. School hours are 8:20 a.m.** – **3:20 p.m.** Students in Pre-kindergarten and Kindergarten will begin during that week on a gradual release schedule. Parents of students in these grades will receive a separate mailing. We will be having a "Sneak a Peek" on Friday, August 25th, from 3:00 – 4:30 p.m.

Open and consistent communication between home and school is essential. We are committed to keeping you informed about your child's progress, important updates, and upcoming events. Our school website, electronic newsletters, and regular communication from your child's teacher will serve as valuable resources to stay connected.

We are eager to begin our new school year focusing on high academic achievement, safe and respectful behavior, and creating lifelong learners with a thirst for knowledge. We encourage you to actively participate in your child's education by visiting the school, participating in events as your schedule permits, joining the PTA and by reviewing and signing your child's planner every evening.
