We would like to thank our parents who continuously support us with our arrival and dismissal procedures. Your adherence to the procedures helps to ensure a safe and orderly environment. As a reminder, in the morning, students can enter the building at 8:20 a.m. Please do not have your child arrive before 8:15 a.m. There is no adult supervision for students that arrive before this time. Also, with the winter season comes colder temperatures. Students will not be permitted inside the building before then. All car riders are to enter the school through the carpool area. No cars are allowed in the bus loop between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Please do not discharge your child on Lyons Mill Road in front of the school. At dismissal, car riders are dismissed from the front lobby. Parents form a line on Lyons Mill Rd. and come into the front loop. Please refrain from parking on Lyons Mill Rd. and walking up to the school. If you would like to come into the school to pick your child up for early dismissal, park in the parking lot on the side of the building. Students who are identified as walkers are expected to walk home. Parents are not to identify students as walkers and then pick them up from the back of the school in a car. If you are picking your child up, they are considered car riders, and they must follow car riders' dismissal procedures. Please be sure to have your new carpool number card displayed on your dashboard. We will only call student numbers, no names. Please contact the school if you have not received a carpool number card.

Any successful school community recognizes the power in effective partnerships between home and school. As parents, you are the foundation of your child's academic success, and your partnership is very important to us. Please don't hesitate to contact us if you need anything.

A few friendly reminders from your school nurse:

- For parents of our youngest students (K-2), please make sure that your child has a weatherappropriate change of clothes to keep at school for accidents or spills. My supply of extra clothing is dwindling, and I no longer have small sized pants to give away. Also, students always feel more comfortable putting on their own clothes from home if they need to change for any reason.
- Students <u>MAY NOT</u> bring any medications to school with them to keep in their backpacks, desks, etc. This includes asthma inhalers, cough drops, or cold medications. If your child needs any medication during the school day, please let me know and I will work with you and their pediatrician to ensure that they receive it in the health suite.
- If your child needs hats or gloves, please have them see me or Dr. Bowman and we will make sure they receive something warm to wear. If you have any hats or gloves to donate, please send them in with your student and we will put them on our hat and mitten tree.
- With the cold weather comes cold and flu season. Please monitor your children at home for
 fever, persistent cough, sore throats, etc. <u>If your child is ill, please do not send them to school.</u>
 If they have a fever, they must stay home for 24 hours from the last temperature over 100.0
 without medication. Masks are no longer available at school, so if you want your child to wear a
 mask, please send them to school with one. Please also make sure that your child is up to date
 with their shots, including their flu and COVID vaccines.
- We have many, many coats, jackets, and hats in our Lost and Found. If your child has come
 home without their coat, it is likely that we have it. Remind your child to check in our Lost and
 Found outside of the cafeteria for their missing items. Please contact <u>myself</u> or the main office
 with any questions.
