At dismissal, car riders are dismissed from the front lobby. All parents are to come through the front loop and give your carpool number so that your child may be dismissed. Please do not park on Lyons Mill Rd. in front of the school to pick up your child. No car riders will be released to someone waiting at the front door. I would also like to remind you that if your child is going to be dismissed early from school, please send in a note to make their teacher aware of this information. Your child will be called to the office when you arrive. All early dismissals should be done before 3:00 p.m. After 3:00, you will be asked to wait for the regular dismissal.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

- Any college or university degrees or certifications held by the teacher.

- Whether the teacher is certified by the state of Maryland to teach a particular grade level or subject area.
- Whether the teacher holds a conditional certificate.

You may also ask whether your child is receiving instructional support services by a paraprofessional. If so, you may request the paraprofessional's qualifications.

If you would like to receive information about your child's classroom teachers and/or paraprofessionals, please make the request in writing to your school principal. The principal will respond within 30 days.

PEACE at DPES

This year the staff and students at Deer Park Elementary School will be participating in our school's PEACE Program. The program was designed in response to a staff and student surveys that were conducted last year. The purpose of the PEACE Program is:

- To increase the sense of student belonging at school.
- To increase student understanding of their role in creating PEACE at school.
- · To teach self-regulation and coping strategies that help increase student time on task.
- To increase positive interactions between students. and staff and students.

Welcome to the 2023-24 school year from the school nurse! I am looking forward to beginning my 6th year here at Deer Park! The beginning of the year is such an exciting time and I love seeing all of my students back in the building. I have missed them!

The beginning of the year is also a busy time in the health office. It's the time of the year when I am busy reviewing paperwork for our new students, collecting medications and forms, and checking for vaccination compliance. Here are a few important points:

- If you have a student who is new to our building, please make sure you have submitted his/her
 most recent vaccination record. I have reached out to all families of students with missing
 vaccinations. Updated vaccination records <u>must</u> be received by September 14 in order to
 prevent students from being excluded from school until they are received. Community
 resources are available for students who need vaccinations of any kind.
- If your child has any new medication information, including newly diagnosed allergies, please let me know as soon as possible so that I can update his/her record.
- Discretionary medication forms will be coming home over the next few weeks, if you have not already received them. They may be returned if you want your child to receive medications such as Tylenol or cough drops, when available, in school. They are completely optional.
- If your child needs to receive a medication in school, such as an inhaler, please contact me for the necessary forms. Students are not permitted to self-carry or administer medications outside of the nurse's office.
- If you have a student in the primary grades, please send in a full change of clothing for them
 to keep in their lockers. Accidents can and do happen, and I have an extremely limited amount
 of spare clothing in my office should a student need to change. Additionally, students typically
 feel more comfortable changing into their own clothing.

Most importantly: If your child is not feeling well, please do not send them to school. This includes any of these symptoms within the previous 24 hour: temperature greater than 100.0, vomiting, diarrhea, or severe headache or sore throat. If your child becomes ill during the school day and needs to be picked up, please arrive promptly to get them. It is very important that your contact information is up to date in our main office and, if you know that you are not typically available during the day, please designate other persons who may be able to pick-up.

I am always willing to help you keep your child safe and healthy any way that I can. Please let me know if I can be of any assistance. 😂

WAYS I WORK WITH STUDENTS



Individual Counseling- The counselor meets with individual students to help solve problems that are interfering with their learning and sense of wellbeing. All students are offered the opportunity to talk with the school counselor about personal problems related to school or home.

Small Group Counseling - The counselor works with students in smaller group settings to address specific areas of concern. Group availability is selected by the counselor based on amount of need. If a group is unavailable, the counselor can work with a student individually.

Parent and Teacher Consultation/Collaboration-

The counselor meets with parents and/or teachers regarding issues with students to ensure academic success for every student.

*Participation in small groups requires a signed consent form to begin sessions.

What are some ways to encourage school-age readers?



Once your child begins nursery school, preschool, or elementary school, you should work with their teacher to improve her reading skills. There are many practical ideas for parents to use with their school-age children to help them develop skills and to encourage good reading habits. By reinforcing the skills your child learns in school, you will be supplementing what he has learned about reading throughout the school day.

Here are some ways to encourage your child to read at home.

- Continue being a good role model
- Encourage your child to read on her own at home
- Keep a variety of reading materials in the house
- Encourage your child to practice reading aloud
- · Write short notes for your child to read
- Encourage activities that require reading
- Establish a reading time, even if it's only 10 minutes each day
- Talk with your child
- Give your child writing materials
- Restrict television time
- Visit the library once a week
- Work in partnership with your child's school

Dear 4th & 5th grade families



My name is Señor Angel Linero (Sr. Linero), and I will be your child's Spanish teacher this year. I will be teaching in his/her classroom once a week for 30 minutes in 4th grade and 50 minutes in 5th grade. Like last school year, students will work with the same grading and scoring system to receive a grade at the end of each quarter. Works will be assigned to be done in the classroom, in Schoology, and in other programs that are assigned by the World Language Department.

During Spanish class, I speak in Spanish 90% or more of the time. Your child is NOT expected to understand everything that I am saying but don't worry, I'll help you understand the material. We will practice a lot through various activities and games so you can rest assured that the process will be a slow one and guaranteeing all the reasonable accommodations that students need to achieve the acquisition of vocabulary in the Spanish language. However, it is your child's responsibility to:

- listen
- participate
- repeat vocabulary
- glue in notes that I provide
- pay attention to words and pictures that are on the board
- · act out the words
- maintain his/her notebook and folder

Remember this process will be little by little and one day at a time so there is no reason to get frustrated, you just have to practice and follow the same rules and activities that are carried out in other subjects. I am passionate about my work as a teacher so I can answer the questions that the students have and explain again as many times as necessary so do not hesitate to raise your hand and ask me the questions you need or you can ask me in private while you are at school or You can send me messages to my email.
